English

- Sharing a range of traditional tales

- Building upon our comprehension skills

Maths

- Looking at measuring length and height
- Consolidating our number skills of counting, sequencing and ordering
- Revisiting addition and subtraction
- Learning to count in 2s and 5s
- Rehearsing our number bonds to 10

Science

- Learning about everyday materials, such as metal, plastic, clay and wood
- Thinking about why certain materials are used for certain objects
- Working in a team to predict, investigate, question and explain

Computing

- Learning about programming
- Developing our coding skills
- Understanding how to add commands to a program

- Learning the Easter story and why it is important to Christians
- Linking ideas to what is important in our lives

Music

- Understanding rhythm and pitch
- Exploring Boomwhackers as a tuned instrument
- Learning to follow a simple musical score

- Rebuilding our own class identity
- Being kind to ourselves and others
- Thinking positively

Art

- Exploring collage techniques
- Creating layered pictures

P.E.

- Exploring traditional dancing
- Creating a short sequence of movements
