#### Reading

<u>Please</u> read with your child. This includes allowing them to read to you and you reading a book to them outside of their reading ability. When you do read your child's school book with them then please make a note of it in their reading record so they can get their raffle ticket for the Reading Rocket!



Ideally children should be changing their school book 3 times a week (dependent of length of book). Re-reading books is a great way to develop their fluency. Remember to ask lots of questions about a book as you go.

## **Supersonic Phonic Friends**

#### **Phonics**

This is our new Phonic Scheme, it aims to build children's speaking and listening skills in their own right as well as to prepare children for learning to read by developing their phonic knowledge and skills. It is a fully systematic, synthetic programme for teaching phonic skills.

#### Reading

The reading books will be working alongside the phonics scheme and will no longer be a colour band system, instead they will move to different groups within Basics 2- Higher 5. Until they are confident with recognising and using their phonic skills they will then move to a colour band system. Please trust your child's teacher to choose the book (s) that will help your child the most.





#### **English**

Reading books helps develop children vocabulary which we will then see them using in their writing.

Encourage your child to do some writing. For example, write the shopping list, make a birthday or Christmas list.

Support your child in learning Common Exception Words (Year 1 and 2). This could start with finding a given word on the CEW board. Then copy the word (look, cover, write check) before moving onto saying a word and child writes how they think it spelt then check.





#### **Maths**

We want to build children's maths fluency and confidence. This takes time and practise. Children need to know number bonds within 100 (10 + 90 and 24 + 76). Start with number bonds within 10 (1 + 9) and once secure move on.

There are some fantastic online games which children can play and learn their maths skills. For example, ICT games and BBC bitesize have free online games.
