<p><b><u>English</u></b></p> <p>We are listening to and reading lots of Superhero stories. We would like you to design your own Superhero!</p> <p>Give your character a Superhero name and then write sentences to describe them. Make sure you are using adjectives so you are painting a picture in the reader's mind.</p> 	<p><b><u>Religious Education</u></b></p> <p>On 12<sup>th</sup> April Christians around the world will be celebrating Easter. We would like you to research why Easter is important to Christians and what they do to celebrate it.</p> 	<p><b><u>Art</u></b></p> <p>Year One will be learning about the artist Paul Klee.</p> <p>We would like you to visit Portsmouth Museum and take a look at all of the different works of art they have on display. Which is your favourite and why? Have a go recreating your favourite painting.</p>  <p>at</p> <p>(Portsmouth Museum is free and has lots of other exhibitions to look at!)</p>
<p><b><u>History</u></b></p> <p>Year One are going to be learning about famous people who are considered heroes, such as Grace Darling.</p> <p>We would like you to find a historical place in Portsmouth and tell us why it is important! There are lots to choose from. You could even take pictures of you there!</p> 	<p><b><u>Music</u></b></p> <p>Listen to 'A Dark Knight' by Hans Zimmer. How does the music make you feel? Create a picture in your mind, like a scene from a film. What is happening whilst this music is playing in the background?</p> <p>You can draw what you see or write it down as a story!</p> 	<p><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>In Maths we have been learning about measuring. We have measured objects using non-standard units (how many paper clips, how many pencils long etc) and also used standard measure using a ruler measuring in cm. Can you have a go at measuring objects around your home either in non or standard measurements?</p>
