








African Adventure Topic Homework ideas

Here are 12 ideas for Home Learning activities. If your child is able to attend school then you should aim to complete a minimum of 3 activities. **If you are having to self-isolate** then complete as many ideas as you can manage to support learning whilst your child is not at school. **For isolating** children there are activities loaded onto Purple Mash to support Phonics Home Learning. Please return the Home Learning book by end of term (18th December) so they can share their work with their class teacher.

<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Go to the library in North End (or search online) and find some books about Africa to complete some research about what it would be like to live there. Write some sentences about what you have found out.</p> 	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Each week there will be 2Dos loaded onto Purple Mash. There are also lots of other activities you can do on Purple Mash. Practise number bonds for each number up to 20 e.g. $2 + 5 = 7$, $7 - 5 = 2$</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>This half term is all about conducting investigations. If so ask if you can take some pictures!
