



## African Adventure Home Learning ideas

Here are 6 ideas for Home Learning activities. Aim to complete as many of the tasks as possible.

| <p>Go to a library and find some non-fiction books about Africa. Research what it is like living in different parts of Africa. You could present your findings by creating a poster, a leaflet or another creative way that you can think of.</p>   | <p>We will be using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 (e.g. 7 + 3, 2 + 8). To help become more confident in recalling the number bonds please practise them at home. This can be done by giving 1 number and your child having to give you the number bond, writing the number bonds down and/or playing some online games.</p>  <p>Visit <a href="https://www.ictgames.com/">https://www.ictgames.com/</a> for a variety of fun games. 'Save the whale' and 'Smoothie Maths' are two great games to play.</p> | <p>We are learning about Mrs Gren. She helps us work out if something is considered: Living, dead or never alive. We would like you to look around your house and find things which fit into those different categories.</p>  <p>We will then move onto looking at different habitats. Linked with your DT home learning, do some research of what the African Savannah is like and how animals who live there are adapted to that environment.</p> |
| <p>As we get more into Autumn, you will notice our local environment changing. Make the most of being out for a walk by observing everything around you. What is happening to the trees? Why are some trees losing their leaves and others aren't? How does it feel now to be outside?</p>  | <p>Make a 'Safari in a box'. Decorate the inside of a box to look like the African Savannah. You could even make some animals to add to the scene.</p>    | <p><u>Dragon Value- Challenge</u></p> <p>Our dragon focus this half term is 'Challenge'. We would like you to set yourself your own challenge. Is there something you want to achieve but still need practise? For example: Learning to tie your shoelaces, beating your previous 'keepy uppy' score or baking the best tasting cake ever!</p>  <p>Present your challenge in your home learning book so you can share your achievement.</p>        |
