Riley is also running a sunflower competition for whoever can grow the tallest sunflower between now and end of August with a prize for the winner!



Road Safety

Both Lyndhurst Road and Crofton Road are one way streets for cars **only**. Cyclists are able to travel in both directions on these roads. We have a number of pupils and parents who cycle, so please be mindful when driving and parking on these roads.

7. Contra-flow pedal cycles in a one-way street



It's a one-way street on which pedal cycles, and only pedal cycles, can go against the flow of traffic. There may be a broken line on the road to show the contra-flow lane or no line at all. If it's a mandatory contra-flow cycle lane that other vehicles cannot enter, there will be a solid white line on the road and on the sign.

Please refrain from dropping your child off in the road as this is highly dangerous. The metal railings around key areas mean your child will struggle to get safely onto the pavement. Younger children will need to be brought into the playground by an adult.



Portsmouth City Council have reinstalled the school zig zag cameras on the streets around our school. They will automatically issue a ticket to anyone stopping on the school zig zags between the hours of 8am and 4pm.

Playground Conduct

In order to keep our playground a safe environment for everyone we wanted to re-share some of the expectations when on the school site:

- Scooters and bicycles should not be ridden in the playground. Children must dismount before entering the playground and walk their scooter or bicycle through to the storage area.
- Please be mindful of the language you are using whilst on the school site – try to refrain from using swear words when there are children present.
- The playground equipment on the infant playground and the Year 3 and 4 playground is not for use before or after the school day. It carries health and safety implications for us as a school so your help with this is appreciated.


