Road Safety Around School

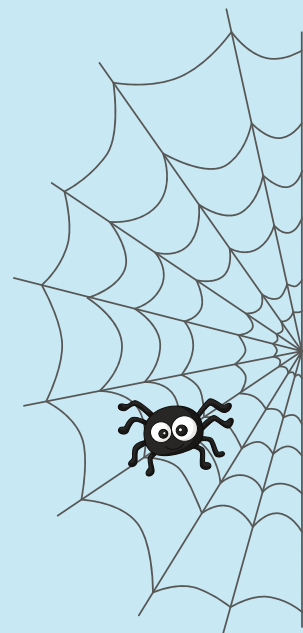


The safety of our children is paramount, and we urge all road users to exercise caution when driving near schools. Speeding, reckless driving, and disregard for traffic rules in school zones put young lives at risk.

The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record
- 5. Avoid costs**
If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare

Most children have the nasal spray vaccine which is the preferred vaccine. A vaccine injection is also available which does not contain gelatine from pigs (porcine gelatine).

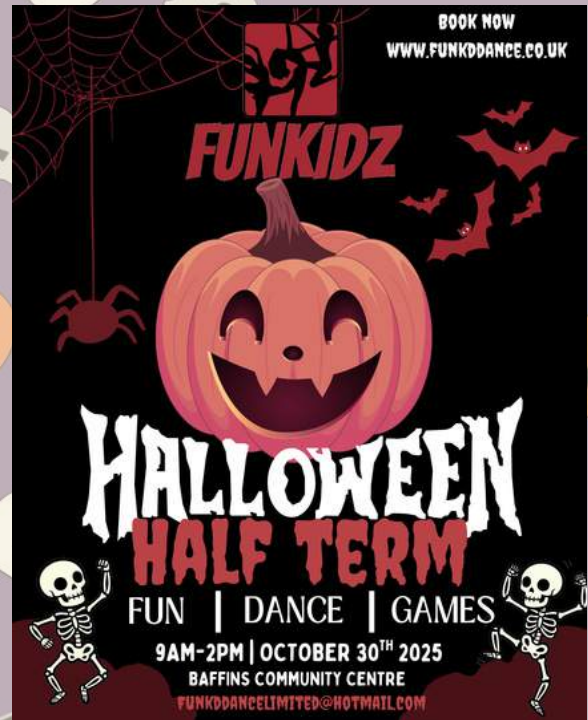
