End of Year reports

I am writing to let you know that your child will be given their report to hand over to you at the end of today, Friday 14th July.

These reports will contain teacher judgements. Please see below for further information about what these teacher judgements mean.

EYFS

Emerging: They have not met the objectives for that learning goal yet.

Expected: They have met the objectives for that learning goal.

Year 1 - Year 6

Working towards the expected standard: *Children are not meeting all of the current year's objectives and may be working below the year group's expectations.*

Working at the expected standard: Children are meeting their current year's objectives.

Working at greater depth within the expected standard: *Children are developing a deeper understanding of their current year's objectives.*

Standardised Assessments

Year 1 reports will contain their phonics results on a separate sheet. The children will be graded as 'working at the expected standard' or 'working towards the expected standard'. The pass mark for the phonics screening check is 32 out of 40.

Year 4 reports will contain their multiplication tables check score, which is marked out of 25. Although there is no pass mark for this assessment, the higher the score, the more secure they are with their recall of times tables facts up to 12×12 . The average score for our school is 19 marks.

Year 6 reports will include their SATS results in Reading and Maths. Your child will also receive a result for Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar. An additional letter explaining what they mean will accompany the reports.
